September 15th to October 15th is Hispanic Heritage Month. This month corresponds with Mexican Independence Day, which is celebrated on September 16, and recognizes the revolution in 1810 that ended Spanish dictatorship.

**September 2**: Krishna Janmashtami, a Hindu celebration of Lord Vishnu's most powerful human incarnations, Krishna, the god of love and compassion. Celebrations include praying and fasting.

**September 3:** Labor Day in the United States. Labor Day honors the contribution that laborers have made to the country and is observed on the first Monday of September.

**September 15 – October 15:** Hispanic Heritage Month. This month corresponds with Mexican Independence Day, which is celebrated on September 16, and recognizes the revolution in 1810

**September 28:** Teacher's Day. Taiwan uses this day to honor teachers' contributions to their students and to society in general. People often express their gratitude to their teachers by paying them a visit or sending them a card. This date was chosen to commemorate the birth of Confucius, the model master educator in ancient China.

**September 23-30:** Sukkot, a seven day Jewish festival giving thanks for the fall harvest.
