

HLC Fact of the Week
(January 20, 2017)

On November 6-7, 2017, Lindenwood University will be visited by a peer review team representing the Higher Learning Commission (HLC). We are currently preparing for this comprehensive evaluation and site visit by writing an Assurance Argument and a required Federal Compliance Report.

Here are a few other “HLC Facts” to consider:

- Lindenwood University has been continuously accredited by the Higher Learning Commission since 1921. Our most recent comprehensive evaluation and site visit was in October of 2013. The University's accreditation was reaffirmed by HLC following that visit.
- HLC is one of six regional accrediting bodies and the one with the largest region (covering 19 states). It operates under the auspices of the U.S. Department of Education.
- Regional accreditation involves accreditation of the institution as a whole (institutional accreditation). HLC does not accredit specific degree programs.
