2. Meet with advisor at least once a semester for program planning and assurance.
3. Pass and submit C-Base or MoGEA required test of basic knowledge scores to LU to fulfill admission requirements for Teacher Education Program.
4. Maintain a GPA of 3.0 in all professional education and content courses required for certification reflecting at least a "C" as a final grade, maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.75.
5. At least 42 hours must be 30000+ level courses, with last 30 hours successfully completed at Lindenwood, 128 total credits minimum.
6. Pass and submit PRAXIS II or other DESE required test of professional competency scores to Lindenwood University prior to student teaching.
7. Complete and submit Application to Student Teach August 30 for spring semester and January 30 for fall semester.
8. Graduation/degree application submitted by Deadlines!
