Scholarship and BFA performance programs audition

Acting:

- One minute contemporary monologue
- One minute contrasting contemporary monologue **or** a 16-bar musical theatre song

Musical Theatre:

- Perform a one minute contemporary monologue
- Perform two contrasting 16 bar musical theatre songs
- Prepare and present 30-45 seconds of dance that showcases your technique (Style is up to the student. This can be self-choreographed, a combination from a show, or choreographed for the audition specifically.)

Tips for creating a successful video:

- 1. Record in front of a neutral background that is quiet and clutter-free.
- 2. The lighting in the room should be natural if possible, but a well lit room is what is most important.
- 3. Be sure the room doesn't echo too much in your recording. If the flooring is tile and the walls are concrete, it might help to "dampen" the room with a rug or padded furniture. If you don't sound good or we can't clearly hear you, your audition will not be well received.
- 4. Record from a solid, stable surface. No hand-held cameras, please.
- 5. For acting and songs, frame the performer from the waist up in the center of the camera. For the dance audition include the full body.
- 6. Convert your file to a mp4 for submission. You may also upload the video to a private YouTube station and submit the link, if you prefer.
