

Federal Student Aid Program Verification Worksheet for 2021-2022

Your application was selected by the U.S. Dept. of Education for review in a process called "verification." In this process, we are required by federal law (34 CFR, Part 668) to compare the information from your application with the information provided on this form by using the IRS data retrieval tool or a **signed** copy of your **2019** Federal IRS Tax Return (and your spouse's if you are married, or your parents' if you are considered dependent for federal aid purposes). If there are differences between your application and the documents you have submitted, corrections may need to be made. We cannot process your federal financial aid until verification has been completed, so please provide the required documents **as soon as possible**.

What you must do:

1. Collect yours (and your spouse or your parents) financial documents: **2019** IRS Federal Tax Return, **2019** W2's, etc...
2. **Complete all sections below, print, and sign the worksheet.** Your parents must also sign if you are required to provide their income information.
3. Contact the Student Financial Services Office if you have questions about completing this worksheet.
4. **Upload***, hand deliver, or mail the completed verification worksheet, **signed** IRS documents, and any other documents to Student Financial Services.
5. ***Upload documents online to www.lindenwood.edu/sfs-secure**
6. An SFS Coordinator will compare the information on the documents you submit to your FAFSA and make corrections, if necessary.
