



2021 Assessment and Planning Summit – Closing the Loop

72 % of faculty and staff surveyed agreed the 2021 Summit helped them to think about assessing rigor, inclusiveness, support and engagement.

162 Lindenwood University attendees included:

- 55 staff members (e.g., Academic Affairs, IT, etc.)
- 26 faculty from the Plaster College of Business & Entrepreneurship
- 39 faculty from the College of Arts and Humanities
- 15 faculty from the College of Education and Human Services
- 27 faculty from the College of Science, Technology, and Health

Actionable Insights

- We could consider how SEEQ (course evaluations) and other data can be helpful in assessing how effective they are in adopting RISE principles and practices.
- We will need to think of ways to continue raising awareness and clarifying understanding around RISE to make sure we have a shared understanding.
- We should continue to consider how RISE is relevant to students, faculty, and staff outside the classroom.
