- Making sure to align with Graduate Attributes.
- More explicit and direct in telling students what we are doing, why and how it relates to course objectives, Graduate
 Attributes, and overall career objectives.
- Going a step further to identify what we are already doing with our students aligns with Graduate Attributes and how it
 can be reflective and measured more specifically.
- Meet in departments to discuss where students are given intentional coursework in Higher Order Learning, Reflective and Integrative Learning, and Collaborative learning, and developing strategies where gaps are present.
