- College program offered at over 1000 institutions across the U.S.
 - Educate & Commission AF Officers
 - Provide fully qualified leaders for the AF

- Real leadership training and growth
- Guaranteed job after college



4-Year Program Overview

- Freshmen/Sophomore's
 - Attend class once/wk, Lead Lab, PT twice/wk
- Attend Field Training during summer
 - 4 weeks in Montgomery, Alabama
 - PT, Drill, Leadership, Firearms, Combat Ops
- Junior/Seniors
 - Attend class twice/wk, Lead Lab, PT twice/wk
 - Leadership position; run PT & Lead Lab
 - Receive AF job Junior year
- Graduate and commission as AF 2Lt

8 – 12 Hrs per week

5 – 7 Hrs

per week

Physical Requirements

- Attend Physical Training
 - Offered 3 times/wk
 - Required 2 times/wk
- Physical Fitness Test (1/semester)
 - Four Events:
 - Max Pushups in 1 minute
 - Max Situps in 1 minutes
 - Waist measurement/Body Composition
 - 1.5 Mile Run





Commitment to the Air Force



- Air Force Commitment Incurred Upon:
 - Acceptance of ROTC Scholarship
 - Freshmen Option
 - Entry Into the POC (Junior Year)

Length of Commitment After Commission

- 4 to 12 Yrs Active Duty
 - Pilots: 10 Yrs Active Duty After Flight School
 - CSOs: 6 Yrs Active Duty After Flight School
 - All Other Career Fields: 4 Yrs Active Duty

Scholarships for H.S. Seniors



- Merit Based, Not Need Based!
- 3 or 4 year, full or partial
 - Type 1 (Full), Type 2 (\$18K), Type 7 (\$9K)
 - \$900/year books and fees
 - Monthly Stipend (\$300 \$500)
- Standards/Requirements:
 - SAT 1100 Total <u>or</u> ACT 24 Composite
 - 3.0 GPA
 - Top 40% in class
 - 17 yrs old
 - US citizen
 - Interview



In College Scholarship/FLEX scholarship



- 2 & 3 Year Scholarships: Highly Competitive
 - Air Force Pays \$9K to \$18K per year
 - \$900 Allowance for Books/Fees
 - Stipend \$300 to \$500 per month
 - Selection Criteria:
 - GPA: Greater Than 2.5
 - Physical Fitness Test Scores
 - Medical Certification Required
 - Must Graduate Under Age 35

- 3 Year Program
 - Complete the GMC in One Year
 - Sophomores Double-Up on ROTC Classes
- 2.5 Year Program
 - At least one semester of GMC
 - Five-Week Summer Field Training
 - Includes Lessons Covered in 2 Yrs of GMC
 - 2 Yrs: "Professional Officer Course" (POC)
 - Contract Signed: Committed to Air Force Service
 - Possible to do only 1.5 yrs as POC
