Originally from Dallas, Texas, ALLISON BURKE has been dancing since she was two years old, training at various pre-professional competitive dance studios across the DFW area. In 2010, she began her collegiate studies at Chapman University to earn a Bachelors in Dance/Choreography and Bachelors in Advertising, with a minor in Film Studies. After graduation in 2014, she moved to Los Angeles and signed with MSA Talent Agency and since, Allison has booked various jobs including dancer for Jennifer Lopez at Global Citizen 2020, LIVE with Kelly Ripa and Ryan Seacrest, "Blindspotting" on STARZ, GARNIER National Commercial, NYC Times Square TruFusion Print Ad Campaign, Latin Grammys with Sebastian Yatra, RISE by Franco Dragone, and Cirgue du Soleil's 2018 & 2019 One Night for One Drop at the Michael Jackson ONE Theatre and "O" Theater. Allison has worked as an assistant to Nappytabs in "Under the Boardwalk" movie by Paramount and for Donnie Osmond Las Vegas Show. She was a Dancer and Artist Coach in Cirque du Soleil's The Beatles LOVE in Las Vegas from 2015-2020 and is currently a Warrior in Cirgue's Michael Jackson ONE directed by Jamie King. While performing, she pursued and graduated with a Masters in Business from LSUS. Allison has been nominated by the Silver State Awards for Local Female Entertainer of the Year for multiple years. She currently choreographs for The Joffrey School, Millennium Dance Complex, and The Rock Center for Dance - she has earned numerous choreography awards in Vegas and Los Angeles.

Born and raised in Nashville, Tennessee, **CARMEN BURLINGAME** attended and graduated from Nashville School of the Arts, where she was appointed a member of the Dance National Honors Society. She also trained in ballet, contemporary, jazz, hip-hop, and tap techniques at Burlingame Studios of Dance. Carmen attended multiple summer dance intensives such as the American Ballet Theatre Summer Intensive, West Virginia University Summer Intensive, and New Dialect Summer Intensive. She is a senior pursuing a BFA degree in dance, specializing in ballet. Throughout her academic journey, Carmen has performed in numerous productions, such as the Fall, Winter, and Spring Dance Concerts from 2021 to 2024. She has also expanded her creative voice by co-choreographing and independently choreographing works during her time at Lindenwood. Set to graduate in 2025, Carmen aspires to join a professional dance company, where she hopes to continue growing as an artist and inspire others through her passion for dance.

Randi's goal is to continue performing with a professional dance team or a jazz dance company and pursuing an accounting career.

EMMA MAXEY is a senior at Lindenwood University currently completing a BFA degree in Dance with a specialization in Contemporary, and a minor in Business. She trained in various styles at Centre Stage Studio in Mount Vernon, Illinois for fifteen years before coming to Lindenwood. Kloey has choreographed works for both the 2024 Winter Concert and now the 2025 Spring Concert, and when she's not in school, she is professionally developing as a staff member with the Universal Dance Association (UDA) and Varsity Spirit.

ERIN MORRIS has been teaching, performing, and competing in jazz and swing dancing for over 20 years. She has enjoyed international artist residencies in Vienna, Berlin, and Krakow but above all loves contributing regularly to her local communities and students. Erin paused her professional lindy hop career in 2020 in order to explore modern dance and broader dance academia, and received her MFA in Dance in 2023 from Washington University in St Louis. Her art-making focus has been on blending her background in Black social jazz dance with personal explorations in postmodernism, and she finds that all paths return her to the importance of improvisation and collaboration with musicians. Her thesis, "Bodies in Jazz" (premiere 2023) is about the performative spectrum of socially-formed dance, from the intimate to the virtuosic. Whether in the studio, the classroom, the forest, or the jazz club, Erin is committed to laying bare cultural roots and discovering a present that is individual, informed, aesthetic, and connective.

JENNA PARSONS from Peoria, IL is a senior at Lindenwood University completing Bachelor degrees in Dance and Business Administration. Prior to attending Lindenwood, Jenna trained at Water Street Dance Company and Creations Dance Studio for fifteen years in ballet, contemporary, modern, tap, jazz, and hip hop. While in high school, Jenna continued her dance training at Gus Giordano's Dance School and led the Washington Pantherettes Varsity Dance Team as Choreography Director. Jenna won two Rising Star Awards in 2018 and 2019, and won State Championships in 2018 and 2020. Since then, Jenna has performed in Lindenwood University's Fall, Winter, and Spring Dance Concerts, and has participated and choreographed in Informal Studio, and Dance for Camera SYNERGY projects. Jenna has had the honor to perform in works created by Joshua Manculich and Hot Crowd.
