Diversity Initiatives

DEI Task Force: (Created 2016)

All faculty, staff, and students are invited to attend committee meetings to discuss and promote strategies and best practices with regards to diversity and inclusion. Meeting dates and times are posted at the beginning of each semester.

Black Student Excellence and Enrichment Program (BSEE)
Open to all students, this program's goal is to increase retention and graduation rates of Black students by promoting academic excellence and enrichment. This program was launched in 2018.

Certificate in Culturally Responsive Assessment: (Created 2019)
Faculty and staff can complete this professional development opportunity to explore assessment practices that are inclusive of and responsive to the diverse nature of our institution.

Participants must complete at least 2 core development activities, at least 3 focused development activities, and a reflective account.



Trainings Offered

Safe Zone Training: (Started 2016)

This is an interactive training provided to help the campus community understand how to support and advocate for LGBTQ+ students, faculty, and staff. Participants will examine LGBTQ+ identities, gender, and sexualty.

Implicit Bias Training: (Started 2018)

This interactive workshop is deigned to define implicit bias, demonstrate common forms of implicit bias and the potential impact on the university community, provide resources on campus, and allow participants to examine their own assumptions and privilege.

Safe Zone 2.0 Training: (Started Spring 2020)

This interactive training has been designed for people who completed Safe Zone. 2.0 will focus on the current issues and laws that are impacting the LGBTQ+ community, examine prejudice privilege, and give participants an opportunity to complete various scenarios.



Trainings Offered

Gender Bias Training: (Started Fall 2020)

This 1-hour, interactive, virtual training session will help the training participants develop an awareness of how gender bias can impact those around them with different genders. Training participants will discover campus resources and strategies to apply what they learned to their environment in order to identify and challenge their own gender bias.

dis Ability Bias Training: (Started Fall 2020)

This 1-hour, interactive, virtual training session will help the training participants develop an awareness of how disAbility bias can impact those around them with different abilities or disAbilities. Training participants will discover campus resources and strategies to apply what they learned to their environment in order to identify and challenge their own disAbility bias.

Cross-Cultural Bias Training: (Started Fall 2020)

This 1-hour, interactive, virtual training session will help the training participants develop an awareness of how cross-cultural bias can impact those around them from different cultures.

Training participants will discover campus resources and strategiesto apply what they learned to their environment in order to identify and challenge their own cross-cultural bias.



Trainings Offered

Socioeconomic Status (SES) Bias Training: (Started Fall 2020)

This 1-hour, interactive, virtual training session will help the training participants develop an awareness of how SES bias can impact those around them with different socioeconomic statuses. Training participants will discover campus resources and strategies to apply what they learned to their environment in order to identify and challenge their own socioeconomic status hias

Spiritual/Religious Bias Training: (Started Fall 2020)
This 1-hour, interactive, virtual training session will help the training participants develop an awareness of how spiritual/religious bias can impact those around them who practice different spiritualties or religions. Training participants will discover campus resources and strategies to apply what they learned to their environment in order to identify and challenge their own spiritual/religious bias.
