CHOREOGRAPHERS

TRACY DUPRE (FACULTY) has been an Adjunct Instructor of Dance at Lindenwood University since 2003. She taught at the Performing Arts Centre and has served as the Tap Dance Coordinator at COCA (Center of Creative Arts) where she taught tap, jazz and choreographed for COCA dance, COCAbiz and COCAcabana. Tracy studied modern dance, musical theatre, West African dance, ballet, choreography, Pilates and video production at Stephens College. She has earned a bachelor's degree in TV & Video Production, Master of Arts in Mass Communication & Digital Media and has completed coursework for her Master of Fine Arts in Dance. She is a board member for the St. Louis Rhythm Collaborative & choreographs for corporate events and dance companies, teaches dance intensives, master classes and has taught at the American College Dance Festival. Choreography credits include the Bob Costas charity event, 60x60 Project, Spring to Dance Festival, Brenda Bufalino's American Tap Dance Festival, Dancin' In the Streets, St. Louis Bilikens basketball team, St. Louis Panera Bread Company, the opening act for a Bobby McFerrin concert as well as a Love & Unity town hall event. Tracy has been interviewed by Dancer Magazine regarding the tap dance scene in St. Louis. She has danced in the Cotton Bowl Parade and attends National Tap Dance Festivals around the country where she has studied & taken class from Jason Samuels Smith, Andrew Nemr, Chloe Arnold, Sarah Reich, Diane Walker, Arthur Duncan, Bril Barrett, Michelle Dorrance, Lane Alexander, Anthony LoCasio, Jumaane Taylor, Diane Walker, Brenda Bufalino, Acia Gray, Savion Glover, Sam Weber, Henry Le Tang, and Van Porter. Recently, Tracy became a National Board-Certified Health & Wellness Coach and is also the owner, videographer, and editor of Brookstone Video.

AMY GAMMON (FACULTY) holds a BA in Dance and a Master of Arts in Teaching with an emphasis in Dance from Lindenwood University. She is currently an Adjunct Instructor of Dance at Lindenwood University, where she has set numerous pieces in the dance concerts, traveled with the students to American College Dance Association teaching tap, hip hop, and yoga, and had the opportunity to choreograph *Urinetown* and *Cinderella* for the Theatre program. Amy is a

co-founder of MoSTly TAP, a St. Louis based tap dance company and has earned the position as a director and convention teacher with Beyond the Stars where she travels around the United States. She has had the privilege of choreographing the opening number for Beyond The Stars Nationals, creating a piece with over one hundred dancers in under a week. She has been teaching at Performing Arts Centre for the last twelve years in multiple genres including tap, jazz, hip hop, ballet, and contemporary and is currently the team coordinator for their competing team. Amy has had the opportunity to choreograph for *Fright Fest* at Six Flags St. Louis. She is a member of Dance Masters of America, a graduate at DMA's Teachers Training School earning the Bachna Scholarship, a yoga teacher through YogaSix, and is the Associate Artistic Director for The DANCE CO. of St. Charles. Amy has a strong passion for teaching, inspiring and motivating students to achieve their goals.

ALYSSA HAKAN (STUDENT) is thrilled to be a choreographer this year! She grew up in Springfield, Missouri, and trained under the direction of Lorraine Dunn from Springfield Little Theatre. She gained her tap training from her mentors, Chloe and Maud Arnold from the Syncopated Ladies and Meghan Way Stinson from Rhythmic Souls Tap Company. Several of her past choreography credits from Springfield Little Theatre include *Chitty Chitty Bang Bang*, *The SpongeBob Musical*, and *White Christmas*. She has also choreographed Big Fish at Central High School and a tap piece for Springfield Dance Alliance. She is a three-time outstanding choreography award winner, including The National Reflections Award of Excellence. She would like to thank her family, friends, and teachers for their support.

SAM MCREYNOLDS (GUEST CHOREOGRAPHER) is a freelance dance artist originally from St. Louis, MO, where he received his BFA in Dance at Lindenwood University and trained closely under hip-hop choreographer/instructor REDD Williams. He quickly discovered a deep passion for choreography/creation throughout his college career. He expanded his understanding of dance greatly through his experience exploring the movement language known as "Gaga" here in the U.S. and in Tel Aviv, Israel. Since moving to LA in 2016, he has worked with several choreographers and dance companies, such as Sarah Elgart / Arrogant Elbow, Brian Friedman, Marguerite

Derricks, No)one. Art House, Ate9 Dance Company, WHYTEBERG, Fabe Dance, The TL Collective, Sidra Bell, Bryan Arias, and many more. He often returns to Kansas City, MO to dance for Owen/Cox Dance Group. His relationship with the company has only grown stronger over the years. As an educator, Sam has served as a contemporary teacher/choreographer at several studios around the St. Louis area, and most recently in LA and Orange County, CA. He has been on faculty with Joffrey Ballet School for the past two years, where he taught and choreographed for the JoffreyRED and JoffreyWest Intensives. He also taught intermediate, advanced, and professional level contemporary this past season at Dmitri Kulev Classical Ballet Academy. As a choreographer, Sam has presented live original works in LA at CONGRESS: Legalize Dance, Club Jete, LAVENDER, Stage & Screen Show, LA Dance Festival International Exchange, and VOICES: Queer Artist Showcase. In May of 2021, he won the Best New Filmmaker Award at the Dare to Dance in Public Film Festival for his dance short film *Proclamation*, which he conceptualized, directed, co-choreographed, and edited. He occasionally holds “GREYaRea” sessions, most consistently at Stomping Ground LA, which serve as a space to workshop movement with dancers of all levels and backgrounds. He has also had the pleasure of hosting several improv jams with live accompaniment and lighting installation. Sam finds much of his inspiration and passion for dance through improvisation both as a mover and an observer.

JANET STRZELEC (FACULTY) holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Dance from Southern Illinois University Edwardsville and a Master of Fine Arts in Directing with a Musical Theatre emphasis from Lindenwood University. Professor Strzelec has been teaching at Lindenwood since January 1998 and served as chair of the dance department from June 2005-May 2021. She has an extensive history of teaching, directing, and choreographing in the greater St. Louis area including work with dance studios, K-12 schools, universities, and professional dance and musical theatre companies. At Lindenwood, Professor Strzelec has enjoyed teaching ballet, pointe, jazz, tap, modern, musical theatre, dance appreciation, dance composition, dance pedagogy and a variety of special topics that included a dance program study abroad trip to Paris. In addition to teaching dance courses, Strzelec has also enjoyed serving as director and/or choreographer for many, many

dance concerts and musicals at Lindenwood. Professor Strzelec's performance credits include ballets, musicals, dinner theatre, television commercials, industrials, and Six Flags Show Productions. Some of her favorite roles are Miss Adelaide (*Guys and Dolls*), Roxie (*Chicago*), Anna (*The King and I*), and dancing as a Friend and Wili in her favorite ballet, *Giselle*. Janet Strzelec has a great love for all things dance, and a great passion for sharing that love with others.

TAYLOR TRICROCE (STUDENT) is a sophomore working toward a BA in Dance and a BA in Elementary Education. Taylor grew up dancing at The Academy of Dance Arts in Warrenville, Illinois. She danced there for fourteen years and was on the competitive team for eleven years. She trained in various styles including ballet, jazz, contemporary, modern, tap, and hip hop. During her time at the Academy, she also gained experience in assisting and teaching younger dancers. In addition to studio dance, Taylor was a member of her high school dance team for three years. She was a captain her senior year and choreographed for the team, as well. Taylor is currently on staff at DaySpring Arts and Education, teaching ballet classes for children ranging in ages from six to sixteen.

TRICIA ZWEIER (FACULTY) is an Associate Professor of Dance & The Dance Program Coordinator at Lindenwood University, where she teaches mostly contemporary and jazz techniques, dance history, dance & technology, and dance science courses. She earned a Master of Science in Kinesiology and a Master of Fine Arts in Dance, with a concentration in choreography, from The University of North Carolina at Greensboro. Zweier performed with The Atlantic City Ballet, Flatlands Dance Theatre, and several international tours in the cruise line industry as a lead dancer and dance captain. Other performance credits include the works of Hanya Holm, Merce Cunningham, Martha Graham, Sean Curran, Mark Dendy, and Nejla Yarkin. She is proudly involved in the St. Louis dance community as a performer and choreographer for Leverage Dance Theater, as guest choreographer and Board Secretary for Modern American Dance Company, as a choreographer for Six Flags St. Louis *Fright Fest*, and as a guest teacher at local dance studios. Her choreography, featuring Lindenwood University students has been chosen for showcase in national festivals including The

Boston Contemporary Dance Festival and The Detroit Dance City Festival in 2018 & 2022. She has also been commissioned to create original work for The Center for Contemporary Dance Pre-Professional Student Intensive (Orlando, FL), The College of Lake County (Grayslake, IL), Texas Tech University (Lubbock, TX), and Six Flags Entertainment Corporation, amongst others. She is also a PBT/PCT certified teacher and a Certified Yoga Teacher (CYT-200). She regularly presents her research at conferences including The National Dance Education Organization, The Missouri Dance Organization, and The International Association for Dance Medicine and Science.
