<p><b>2.1 Ethical Reasoning:</b>  <b>Definition</b> Ethical Reasoning is a habit of mind demonstrated by analyzing, interpreting, and/or evaluating ethical values, issues, and/or dilemmas. Ethical Reasoning is reasoning about right and wrong human conduct. It requires students to be able to assess their own ethical values and the social context of problems, recognize ethical issues in a variety of settings, think about how different ethical perspectives might be applied to ethical dilemmas and consider the ramifications of alternative actions.
