- 3. Maintain a GPA of 3.0 in all professional education and content courses required for certification reflecting at least a "C" as a final grade, maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.75.
- 4. Complete and submit Missouri Educator Profile (MEP) at designated benchmarks.
- 5. Pass and submit PRAXIS II or MoCAE to Lindenwood University prior to student teaching.
- 6. Submit MoPTA tasks.
- 7. Complete and submit Application to Student Teach August 30 for spring semester and January 30 for fall semester.
- 8. Graduation/degree application submitted by Deadlines!

To complete the Master of Arts in Teaching Program <u>all students must</u>:

- 9. Complete 45 semester hours of graduate course work required to earn the specified Master of Arts in Teaching degree and certification.
- 10. Graduation/degree application submitted by Deadlines!
- 11. Select the Master of Arts Project (EDU 60000) OR Curriculum Analysis and Design (EDU 52000) to fulfill final degree requirements. Continue to register for the thesis/Master of Art Project each subsequent term until completed. Failure to continue to register will result in termination from the candidacy for the degree.
- 12. Complete the degree requirements within five calendar years from the first day of the first term in which program commenced.

MISSOURI DEPARTMENT OF ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY EDUCATION CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS FOR SECONDARY EDUCATION

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS:

EDU 52000 Curriculum Analysis and Design

EDU 60000 or Master of Arts Project

A. A baccalaureate degree from a college or university having a teacher education program approved by the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education;

- B. Must have recommendation of designated official for teacher education in the college or university;
- C. Must have a grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale overall and in the major area of study;
- D. Must complete the content knowledge or specialty area test designated by the State Board of Education with a score equal to or greater than the Missouri qualifying score. If no content knowledge or specialty area test is designated for the area of concentration, completion of the Principles of Learning and Teaching: Grades 9-12 test is required with a score equal to or greater than the Missouri qualifying score;
- E. Completion of professional requirements as determined by the recommending college or university, which may exceed these minimum requirements; and

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F. Individuals who completed their teacher education program outside of the United States shall provide documentation of completion of course work in the following:

All 9-12 Certification Candidates who completed the bachelor degree OUTSIDE of United States are required to complete:

- 1. English Composition, two (2) courses, each a minimum of two (2) semester hours;
- 2. U.S. History, three (3) semester hours; and
- 3. U.S. Government, three (3) semester hours.
