The oldest and most celebrated building on campus is Sibley Hall. It was named after Mary Easton Sibley and Major George C. Sibley, who founded Lindenwood. This building replaced the original log cabin structure and is also registered in the National Register of Historic Sites.

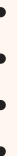
### ORGANIZATION SPOTLIGHT: Delta Zeta
